#### **BACKGROUND**

Council at its meeting on the 17th September, 2002 resolved to approve of the Shire of Leonora Town Planning Scheme No 1 Amendment No 9 and that approval be sought from the Department of Planning and Infrastructure prior to advertising the Scheme Amendment. On the 4th November, 2002 the Western Australian Planning Commission advised that the Commission's approval to the grant of consent for the Amendment to be advertised was not required. The Commission further advised that as the Amendment was consistent with the requirements of Regulations and was adopted after 3rd May, 2002, Council could advertise the Amendment without seeking consent.

A notice was published in the Kalgoorlie Miner on the 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2002 advising that the Shire of Leonora had prepared a Scheme Amendment to carry out various modifications / amendments to the Town Planning Scheme including –

- Re-zoning properties in Kurrajong and Steel Streets.
- Re-zoning Reserve 41956 and portion of Reserve 41510
- Amending Table 1 Zoning Table
- Introducing a new definition Tourist Development.

The notice further advised that submissions in regards the Amendment should be lodged in writing on or before the 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2002.

Adjoining and nearby land owners were notified of the proposed Amendment during the advertising period. The following authorities were consulted during the advertising period –

- Western Power
- Water Corporation
- Telstra Corporation
- Heritage Council of WA
- Environmental Protection Authority

The Heritage Council of WA, Water Corporation and then Environmental Protection Authority supported the proposed Amendments. Western Power and Telstra Corporation did not respond. Other than general comments supporting the Amendment, no submissions were received.
