The team at Outback Grave Markers visited Leonora in October to begin the project of marking the Leonora Cemetery. The project will take some time to complete and they will return soon to continue their incredible work.

Outback Grave Markers have been working in the Goldfields and other regions for many years now, with hundreds of graves now marked. The team identify lonely and unmarked graves through “consultation with station owners, local historians and traditional owners in conjunction with Yvonne and Kevin Coate, the authors of *Lonely Graves*, and other genealogists who have previously undertaken extensive research in this area.”

Their important work ensures that individual’s stories and the history of the region won’t be forgotten.

Did You Know...?

TRUMP GOLD MINE RIFLE CLUB

In January 1901, a well attended meeting was held at the Trump Gold Mine, which was situated 5kms north of Leonora, for the purpose of forming a rifle club, about 20 members enrolled.

A reserve of 170 acres (68 hectares), 1 mile long (1.6kms) and a quarter of a mile wide (0.4kms) was gazetted as a rifle range in June 1901.

In August 1901, most of the members of the Club joined the National Rifle Association of W.A. as a defence rifle club, which rendered each member liable to be "called out" if the State was to be invaded.

By August 1902, the Trump Gold Mine Rifle Club had amalgamated with the Leonora District Rifle Club (pictured below).

This magnificent cup was presented by H. Abelman Esq. to Trump Rifle Club, which was won by Henry McLeod in Leonora, April 1901.

NATIONAL SKIN CANCER ACTION WEEK

Did you know?

Skin cancers (including melanoma) are the most common cancers affecting both women and men in Western Australia. In 2017, 874 Western Australian men and 593 Western Australian women were diagnosed with melanoma. The majority (55-70%) of melanomas are detected by patients themselves, or their partners.

Common symptoms of skin cancer to look out for include:


- A new spot or mole on your skin
- A spot that is different from other spots on your skin
- Any crusty or non-healing sores
- Any spots, freckles or any moles changing in size (width), thickness (height), colour, or shape over a period of weeks to months.

Get to know your skin and what's normal for you, particularly if you're over 40 years of age. If you notice any of these symptoms or any other unusual changes tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. It doesn't mean you've got skin cancer – often they turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to get checked.



How to check your skin

In a room with good light, undress completely and use a full-length mirror to check your whole body. To check areas that are difficult to see, use a handheld mirror or ask someone to help you.



If you notice any changes to your skin, make an appointment with your general practitioner (GP) or dermatologist straightaway (see next page). You will have a better outcome if the skin cancer is found and treated early. For more information on checking your skin, visit sunsmart.com.au/skin-cancer/checking-for-skin-cancer.

If it is skin cancer, the earlier it's found, the greater the chance of successful treatment.



Trainer Neil collected the Leonora Cup on behalf of the owners.

The day catered for families too by having Angie the Fairy and her Elf working their magic with face painting and glitter tattoos for both children and adults. Many beautiful creations were seen as you wandered around the race grounds.

The day included some great music by BJ the DJ which went on into the night as the races ended and the Two Up event commenced to keep punters engaged a bit longer.



St Barbara's Leonora Province Plan

St Barbara is currently working on plans to develop additional resources in and around Leonora to support filling the mill with St Barbara mined ore over the longer term. We refer to this effort as the Leonora Province Plan and would like to share an outline of this work to inform the community of work that will be happening locally around the area.

A Pre-Feasibility Study (PFS) for Tower Hill and Stabroek Lights commenced at the start of July 2021. As part of the PFS study there are plans for drilling campaigns at Tower Hill, Stabroek Lights, the Jasper Region and within the Gossalia mine to give us a fuller understanding of these ore bodies so we can outline our plans for Leonora.

What is a pre-feasibility study?

Pre-feasibility is an early stage of investigation which focuses on expanded drilling programs and internal studies to build confidence in a project. There are several stages of project development before approval is granted and any investment is made.

How long will the PFS take?

The pre-feasibility study is scheduled to be completed in June 2022.

Should the project progress, an Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) would be undertaken.

What is an ESIA?

An ESIA is a study that assesses the impacts of a development and includes community engagement along with all associated studies e.g. noise, traffic, and social impacts.

What activities are planned?

Activities will include:

- Clearance surveys throughout the region.
- Drilling associated with the PFS near the Gossalia site and around Tower Hill and Stabroek Lights, while exploration drilling continues in the Jasper region.
- Engagement with those nearest the activity will be engaged directly ahead of any drilling.

Recently the Senior Community Engagement Specialist Wendy Mathews, along with Kylie Okely, Manager Lands, and Jenique Venable, Land Officer undertook community engagement in relation to the Leonora Province Plan. Local residents who live within 100 metres of the planned drilling program were contacted via a doorknock campaign to inform them of St Barbara's future plans.

Feedback from the residents we spoke to was positive and they were all provided a detailed flyer about the planned drilling which included a detailed map of the locations of the drilling.

As the Leonora Province Plan progresses, the community will continue to be kept updated via face-to-face briefing sessions, letter drops and posts on the Leonora Grapevine.
