POLICE UPDATE

G'day from your local cop shop!

It's our first official 2022 update and we have news!

Firstly, we have had two new members join us to fill the gaps left behind by recent departures. Kevin Guy has transferred from Kalgoorlie Police Station after serving a seven year stint there. Brendon Livingstone is a returning Leonora officer, after leaving here years ago to go to Kalgoorlie. Both are experienced Goldfields officers, who will do a great job at helping to serve our community.

Secondly, we've been busy— very busy. Aside from our regular call outs to assist members of our community, we recently had a nasty burglary where a group of persons broke into a unit and attempted to steal a car. Following the early morning call, the Kalgoorlie Detectives and forensics team came up to assist. With their assistance, two adults and four juveniles were charged and held in the cells overnight. They are now all subject to the court process.

Now, the subject that we are all bombarded with—COVID-19. I can imagine that we're all sick of it (pun intended) but it is something that we will have to live with for the time being. We are as prepared as we could be here at the station, with an abundance of PPE and almost enough hand sanitiser to swim in. But this valuable equipment will only help us go so far. The best thing we can all do to help ourselves and each other is to get vaccinated, which I personally believe Leonites are doing an excellent job of doing. Our double vaccination level is good, and our triple vaccination rate is coming along as well. Please continue the good work. Your sense of community is what is going to help stave off the worst of this virus.

Under the Proof of Vaccination Directions issued by the WA Government, as of 31st January 2022, proof of double vaccination will be required for patrons to enter the following Shire of Leonora venues;

Shire of Leonora Indoor Gym—As of 31st January 2022, membership cards have been made inactive. For membership cards to be reactivated, proof of being fully vaccinated or proof of exemption is required. If unable to provide proof, reimbursement of unused portion of gym membership fees will be made upon request. Gym members can present proof of vaccination or proof of exemption at **Shire of Leonora Administration Building 16 Tower Street, Leonora between hours 8:00am-4:30pm Monday to Friday.**

Shire of Leonora Recreation Centre, Oval Complex and Bowls Club — When hiring these venues, event organisers will be required to show proof of vaccination or exemption at the time of collecting the keys from the Shire of Leonora Administration Office. As the host of a private event held in a public space, it is then the responsibility of the event organiser to check proof of vaccination of all attendees of the event who are over the age of 16. Community sport is exempt from proof of vaccination requirements.

Hoover House Café at Gwalia Historic Precinct—Patrons wishing to be seated at the café must show proof of being fully vaccinated or proof of exemption prior to ordering food or drinks at the café counter. Take-away purchases are permitted but must be consumed other than at the place from which they are purchased.

Did You Know...?

LEONORA STATE BATTERY

The Leonora State Battery machinery was manufactured in Adelaide before being shipped to Fremantle in October 1898 and then sent to Leonora by rail and road. The construction of the Battery was undertaken by Mr J. Whitelaw and completed in January 1899.

A public holiday was granted in Leonora for the opening of the Battery, which was opened by the Minister for Mines, Mr Lefroy, with local MLA Mr Gregory also in attendance. As the story goes, the official opening ended up being a dry affair as the Minister was running late and all the celebratory liquor was consumed by the locals before the official opening began.

Despite the much-anticipated opening, doubts had been expressed about the ability of the well to provide enough water for the operation of the battery. Indeed, within weeks of opening, the battery had to close due to lack of water. However, a new well was quickly constructed on the site, which allowed the battery operation to resume. Additionally, an inquiry was held in regard to the management of the battery. Due to these water and management issues, the first year of operation was not a financial success, however, the battery was believed to be of benefit to the prospectors and, so, operations continued.

Western Australia was the only state to provide these government owned and run ore-crushing facilities. They were provided to assist gold prospectors and small mines with processing their gold. As time went on public batteries became less viable, with some facilities operating for only a year or two, while others operated for upwards of 50 years. Leonora was one of the few remaining batteries that came under the control of the WA Mint in 1984 but eventually all facilities were closed by 1989.

The Heritage Council describes the Leonora State Battery site as significant, in that it is a "reminder of the (continuing) importance of mining to the settlement, growth and development of the Leonora area."

Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

GERALDTON CHAMPION URGES OTHERS TO KNOW BOWEL CANCER SYMPTOMS

Former Geraldton disability support worker, John McLellan, is urging those in regional WA to familiarise themselves with bowel cancer symptoms after being diagnosed with the disease in July 2017. Mr McLellan had recently moved to Geraldton from Perth when he began experiencing some unusual symptoms.

"I noticed some aches and pains and had become very constipated," Mr McLellan said.

"I had also become very tired in both my body and my mind. Once day the pain escalated to the point that I collapsed and was taken to the hospital where the medical team performed an endoscopy and colonoscopy, and shortly after I received the bowel cancer diagnosis."

Mr McLellan underwent chemotherapy for bowel cancer and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. Due to three major blockages, he had almost 30cm of his bowel removed.

"If something is not right, see the doctor first. If you're not happy with the outcome, go for another opinion," he said.

Cancer Council WA's Goldfields Regional Education Officer, Rachel Jolly, said the earlier cancer is found, the better your chances of survival.

"Cancer Council WA is currently airing a campaign involving regional champions to highlight the three lesser-known cancer symptoms, which are shortness of breath, runny poo and problems peeing," Ms Jolly said.

"The campaign also encourages regional people over 40 years of age to visit their doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker if they notice anything unusual with their body.

"Unfortunately, people living in regional Australia have lower rates of five-year survival for all cancers combined, compared to people living in a metropolitan area."

"Please visit your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker if you have blood in your poo, even just on one occasion, or other symptoms that may be a sign of bowel cancer if they go on for more than four weeks. This can include changes to your normal bowel habit, such as runny poo, pooing more often or finding it hard to poo, a new pain, lump or swelling in your tummy, feeling tired, looking pale or losing weight without trying.

"It's important to know that bowel cancer screening kits are designed for people who are not experiencing symptoms and waiting to participate in screening when you have a symptom could delay your diagnosis and risk a worse outcome.

"If you notice anything unusual , please see a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker."



Try a Trade Pilot Project Colab successfully launches within the Leonora Community...

Our first collaborative trial CDP Project **TRY A TRADE** was successfully launched on the **29th November 2021** within the Leonora Community after close consultation with participants, stakeholders and local community members.

This trial-based pilot was led and delivered through **Central Regional TAFE**, providing innovative new ways of direct remote community-based training and education delivery.

Recognition of training was given through Nationally Recognised Certification.

Careful planning with Central Regional TAFE ensured we delivered a tailored approach to different age cohort needs, building on employability - igniting a career in trades pathways!

We were proud to partner with **Central Regional TAFE**, **Leonora Youth Centre** and **Leonora District High School** and aim to replicate this concept across the Yaaliku Region for 2022/23 as we transition to the new Remote Jobs Model.
