## TOURIST SEASON BEGINS



Tourist season is well underway for the Shire of Leonora, with travellers rolling in from all over the country now that the heat has disappeared and the WA border has reopened.

Gwalia Historic Precinct is a highlight for anyone visiting the region, and they have been busy the last few weeks with new and returning explorers coming by for a visit. Over the summer months, when things were quieter, the staff of Gwalia Museum were preparing for their visitors with a big spring clean.

New flooring was installed into the Assay building at the end of last year. In preparation for this, the storeroom was cleaned out and all items are now sorted and stored in the newly lined shed.

The gardens have had a good pruning and many hours were spent raking leaves within and outside the fenced area. The reticulation and water leak issues have been resolved, taking the stress away from watching a green lawn turn a slight shade of pale. Along with these water issues being resolved, the water pumps for Hoover House have been replaced, now ensuring the water does not cut off on our guests.

With Hoover House Café and Bed & Breakfast not being as busy over the summer months, the main buildings have had a great deal of attention given to housekeeping jobs that needed dedicated time for completion. Ken also had some attention, with a deep clean being completed inside, outside and underneath.

The cottages have had some repairs and cleaning done, along with the surrounding grounds also getting a tidy up.

Some changes to the museum include a reshuffle of the reception area, with the desk and souvenir displays being moved around to lend a better view of the mural on the inside wall. Seating has been installed throughout the museum grounds, and a large St Barbara dump truck mural has been installed on the outside wall of the office building.

And, finally, the job that took the prize for being the hottest and dustiest (and probably the least fun) goes to the Winder Shed pit clean up.

Thanks to all involved in getting your hands (and arms and legs and faces) dirty to ensure we keep the space looking great for our visitors.

## MALCOLM DAM UPGRADES



In March 2021 the Shire of Leonora announced its intention to empty Malcolm Dam, in an attempt to clean up the water and make it safer for the public and wildlife.

The dam was dug out in the early 1900s in order to provide water for the steam trains. Since that time the dam level has varied significantly depending on the rain, but has never been pumped dry. Today, Malcolm Dam is a popular spot to visit for locals and tourists alike, for swimming, camping and picnics. It is also frequented by local wildlife including kangaroos and birds

The bottom of the basin is approximately 6 metres from ground level and when the flood plain is full there is approximately 350,000m<sup>3</sup> of water-adding an additional metre or two to the basin depth.

The introduction of feral fish, along with rubbish left behind by visitors, meant that the water became polluted, leading to dead fish and consequently making the water unsafe for humans and animals to swim and drink from.

In the 12 months since the pumping project began, the area has received some rain which has refilled the basin enough that the locals can return to their local swimming hole. While we still need a lot more before the area will be full again, birds have already been spotted at the dam, including a family of swans.

The Shire of Leonora have also been busy upgrading the facilities at the dam. Visitors will now find shaded picnic tables, concrete firepits, and additional bins. This project was made possible thanks to the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) grant. Part of the funds from this grant also went to the new public toilets and the completion of Yingkapayi Park.

The LRCI Program was developed to help support local governments around Australia to deliver projects to help communities recover from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Did You Know...?

## LEONORA'S FIRST AMBULANCE



Excerpt from *As Time Goes By* by Robert E Crofts

"This ambulance was constructed on a 'Dodge' 1937 two tonne truck chassis, which was fitted with truck wheels and tyres.

At the time, this vehicle operated on corrugated gravel roads, which proved to be a somewhat rough ride. It also had a dust problem on long trips, to the discomfort of the patient.

The ambulance was originally housed at the Leonora Power House and relied on voluntary drivers to operate it. This arrangement proved unsatisfactory, as at times a driver was not always available. However the Manager of the Sons of Gwalia Mine had a suitable building erected at the mine to house the local ambulance and it was then transferred to the mine site. The Manager's chauffeur was entrusted with its care and maintenance, as well as being its driver. He was also a certified ambulance officer at the time.

The ambulance provided a sterling service for many years, including many trips to Kalgoorlie District Hospital, transferring patients for specialist treatment and care. After WWII it was replaced with a later model."


### Golden Gift—Continued Support





St Barbara and Waalitj Foundation are working on a community arts project at our accommodation Village in Leonora.

We have commenced discussions with local Aboriginal artists to have artwork in two locations at our Village:

- Mural on our Village Recreation Room (Stage 1)
- Mural across our Village front fence from Gate 1 to Gate 2 (Stage 2)

A site visit will be taking place in May with Waalitj CDP Community Engagement Manager Bianca Corciulo and local artists who have expressed interest to be involved. The artists will then provide concepts of their proposed designs to St Barbara and the final designs chosen. All concepts must represent the culture and history of the Leonora region.

This is an exciting project that St Barbara and Waalitj Foundation are proud to be partnering together on. It not only provides a visual that the whole community can enjoy viewing relating to their local culture, but also provides opportunities for employment for local Aboriginal artists while they undertake this important work.

The aim is to have Stage 1 completed to unveil as part of NAIDOC Week celebrations. Stage 2 will be completed later in the year.

## Leonora Province Plan Update

### Acquisition of Bardoc Gold

On 13 April 2022, St Barbara completed the acquisition of Bardoc Gold. The acquisition delivers St Barbara ownership of the advanced Aphrodite and Zoroastrian underground deposits. Through this acquisition we expand our presence in the Goldfields region and further establish ourselves as a growing gold mining company.

### Drilling in and around Leonora

As previously advised, we have undertaken drilling at Tower Lights and Harbour Lights over the past few months.

Tower Lights drilling has concluded, and we are about to commence drilling around Harbour Lights. The map over the page shows the completed work at Harbour Lights, planned work and where we are currently drilling.

## Leonora Province Plan Update cont'd

On Monday, 9 May we will be commencing earthworks at HL\_Prop\_04 and 06, on the immediate northern edge of town (lower right-hand corner of map). Drilling of these two holes will take between 14 and 21 days and will run 24/7 during that time.

Due to the close proximity to town for this drilling, St Barbara have put in place a sound barrier which will comprise of a row of double stacked shipping containers.

St Barbara will continue to keep the Leonora community updated on Leonora Province Plan for the region.
