## #SAFERLEONORA INITIATIVE ANNOUNCED



In March the Shire of Leonora worked with Leonora Police to launch the beginning stages of a new initiative aimed at increasing community safety and reducing crime.

Over six weeks community members and stakeholders were invited to participate in a range of engagement activities, in order to help develop a Community Safety and Crime Prevention Strategy, that will be headed by a new committee.

A number of activities were conducted, including a community survey, of which 73 people responded. Through the survey it was determined that the largest concerns for safety within the community were alcohol-related issues, disengaged youth, and general antisocial behaviour.

Those engaged in the consultation process covered a broad cross-section of the Leonora community, with representation from all age groups, genders and cultural backgrounds, including both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people.

The new committee will be formed under Council with representatives from Leonora Police, Hope Community Services, Department of Communities, Department of Education, Country Health, Nyunngaku Women's Group, Leonora Youth Centre, Leonora Shire, and other members of the community including Aboriginal leaders.

The purpose of the committee is to work collaboratively with a diverse range of resources to develop and implement the #SaferLeonora 2022-2027 strategic plan. The plan's focus will be creating safe places and spaces, supporting families, children and youth, reducing the impact of alcohol, and community action, connection and involvement.



# Did You Know...?

## HEARSE'S FINAL RESTING PLACE



Leonora's hearse began its life as a buggy, estimated to have been built in the 1880s and drawn by two horses. It was brought to Leonora in 1900 when Undertaker Joseph Semken moved here to establish an undertaking and livery stables.

The horse-drawn hearse was kept busy in the early days due to the high number of mine accidents, infant fatalities, suicides, and infectious diseases at the time. It even served as transportation for a wedding in 1906, delivering the groom some 20kms when flooding had cut off the

railway line between Malcolm and Leonora.

After World War I the hearse was converted to a motor vehicle, by mounting the carriage to the back of a 1927 Chevrolet Erskine Tourer taxi. One young man was quite upset by the conversion and said that he would prefer to be taken to his funeral by horses. Several years later, following his tragic drowning, the hearse was changed back to a horse-drawn vehicle especially for his funeral.

It was then placed back on the Chevrolet body, and has remained this way until the present day. The hearse was used regularly up until approximately 1970, when it became too dilapidated. It was restored in the 1980s and used several more times, including for the 1993 funeral of an Albany multi-millionaire who was killed in a helicopter accident in Hawaii. Mr Semken's grandchildren came from over east for Leonora's centenary celebrations and drove the hearse in the street parade.

The hearse was again restored in 2016 by the Kalgoorlie Men's Shed and is now on display at the Gwalia Museum, where it houses a somewhat controversial coffin.



### Coffin

**Kalgoorlie had its own Brewery, "Hannan's", which was taken over by Swan Brewery in 1980 and closed altogether in 1982.**

Leonora acquired the last keg of Hannan's Beer and decided to ceremoniously bury the keg in a coffin and have a celebratory wake at the White House Hotel, Leonora.

A couple of locals, Tim Hughson and Jim Fitzgerald, decided to move it "for safe keeping" and stored it at Nambi Station. The culprits were eventually caught and faced justice by "Kangaroo Court" where they owned up and gave the keg back. No sooner was it returned then the keg was stolen again, spending the next six years in Neil Johnson's shed.

A reward of \$5,000 was offered by Bond Brewing in November 1988 for its return, most of which was donated to charity.

The publican at the White House wanted the coffin to be kept so he could be buried in it - sadly he moved away before he died and never got his wish.

### Ingredients

- ▲ 2 sweet potatoes, peeled and diced
- ▲ 2 potatoes, peeled and diced
- ▲ 2 tbs skim milk powder
- ▲ 2 tbs canola oil
- ▲ 1000 g kangaroo mince
- ▲ 1 onion, diced
- ▲ 2 carrots, diced
- ▲ 3 stalks celery, diced
- ▲ 2 cups frozen peas
- ▲ 1 x 400g can no-added-salt brown lentils, drained
- ▲ 1 tbs worcestershire sauce
- ▲ 1/2 cup water
- ▲ 2 tbs reduced-fat cheddar cheese, grated

### Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C.
2. Fill a large pot with water. Place sweet potato and white potato into water, bring to the boil and cook for 10-15 minutes until soft.
3. Drain potatoes and mash together with skim milk powder.
4. Heat oil in fry pan, place kangaroo mince into the pan and cook until browned.
5. Add chopped vegetables, frozen peas, lentils, Worcestershire sauce and 1/2 cup of water. Cook for 15 minutes.
6. Place mixture into a casserole dish.
7. Spread mashed potato on top of mince mixture and smooth with spoon. Top with grated cheese. Bake for 45 minutes or until golden brown on top.

*"I gave up 7 years ago. One of my reasons was that I had a very bad dose of the flu and couldn't breathe. I knew giving the cigs away would help. For me, quitting was something I could do to improve my health for myself. I convinced myself that smoking was a habit that I didn't want to have any more. I feel fantastic and look a lot younger than I am and have lovely skin. Fast forward to today. My mother has been diagnosed with COPD after a lifetime of being a heavy smoker. To see her now is very sad. She cannot walk more than around 10 meters before she needs to stop and catch her breath. In short, I am watching my mother die a cruel horrible slow death caused by smoking."*






