



LEONORA GOLDEN GIFT WEEKEND

GOLDEN GIFT 2022

The WA Day Long Weekend is always a highlight on the calendar for the Leonora community, and this year didn't disappoint. With a full programme of events, there was something for everything, including free kids activities, market stalls, food vans, and live music. For anyone who competed in an event, there was plenty of prize money up for grabs.

The weekend kicked off on Friday night with the auction fundraiser at the White House Hotel hosted by Mr Terry Demasson. Prizes included signed football memorabilia, accommodation vouchers, hand crochet blankets, return flights to Perth, luxury gift hampers, Rec Centre memberships, and more!

This year we saw the return of the weekend-long lawn bowls tournament, following the raving success of the inaugural event last year. Leonora Bowls Club played host to teams from across WA who travelled to Leonora to compete for thousands of dollars in prizes.

The crowd favourite Workboot Sprint was held on Saturday evening before the Elite Mile Heats, and included three events—the men's sprint, the women's sprint and the relay.



Activities for the kids were set up at the Youth Zone at the newly opened Yingkapayi Playground, including face painting, magic tricks, and a silent disco on Saturday Night. Rad Rock Climbing Adventures returned this year, bringing with them their popular inflatables, 8m rock climbing wall, and high ropes course.

There was also the kid's athletics carnival on Sunday, the children trained for weeks leading up the event, and they all did incredible.

Saturday night's events ended with the St Barbara Community Concert and fireworks. Starting off the evening's festivities was Cameron Alexander, an indie folk singer-songwriter who grew up down the road in Leinster. Fronting the concert was The Southern River Band, a rock band hailing from Perth, with a sound reminiscent of the classic rock bands of the 70s and 80s. Leonora was promised "one of the best live acts in Australia" and the band did not disappoint—even keeping on theme with frontman Callum Kramer's gold sequined pants.



Hoover House hosted their annual Big Breakfast on Sunday morning, where visitors were treated to a gold coin donation bbq breakfast on the manicured lawns of Hoover House at Gwalia Museum, overlooking the working open pit gold mine.

Sunday's festivities continued with the lawn bowls tournament, kids activities and the always popular food vans and market stalls, and of course, the athletics carnival. The Goldfields Cyclclassic also concluded its final leg in Leonora, with competitors crossing the finish line on the main street where the athletics carnival was being held.

The athletics carnival included a variety of running events, including a kids relay, 120m sprints, 600m runs and the Elite Mile Finals. The winners of the Elite Mile each took home \$7,500 and a gold nugget.

CHEAPER FLIGHTS FOR RESIDENTS

The State Government has committed funding of up to \$19.8 million until 2025 to airlines operating on eligible regional air routes, to make it easier for residents of regional towns in Western Australia to stay connected to family, friends and essential services in Perth.

The Regional Airfare Zone Cap is a joint initiative between the State Government and the airline industry. It allows WA regional residents access to capped airfares for travel on return flights to Perth and back home, subject to seat availability.

Zone Cap fares are available only for residents of WA living outside of the Perth and Peel regions. The flights must be booked as a return fare that departs and returns to the same regional destination, and is only available for travel for personal reasons.

For those towns located within 1000km from Perth, fares are capped at \$199 one way (\$398 return), and for those further than 1000km from Perth, the cap is \$299 one way (\$598 return). This means that Leonora residents will now be able to fly to Perth and back to visit family or attend appointments for only \$398!

The Zone Cap is designed so regional residents travel from their nearest airport. There are exceptions for those living between airports, which mean that Leonora residents qualify for the capped fares when flying from Leonora or Kalgoorlie to Perth.

Are there any additional costs under the Zone Cap?

Optional extras, such as excess baggage, credit card booking fees, and in-flight meals or entertainment, may attract additional charges which may vary depending on the airline.

What if I find a cheaper fare than the Zone Cap?

Airlines will continue to offer promotional, community and other special (sale) fares that would be cheaper than the Zone Cap fare. You can still book a sale fare that is lower than the Zone Cap fare if it is available.

What are the booking conditions for the Zone Cap fare?

Specific T&C's vary between airlines. For example, the number of resident fares you can purchase per year, the number of changes you can make free of charge, or whether the fare are non-refundable. Please check with the airline before booking.

GWALIA MUSEUM ITEMS LAUNCHED ONLINE

On Wednesday 15th June, 2022 the new WAnderland portal was officially unveiled by Culture and the Arts Minister David Templeman at the WA Museum Boola Bardip. The portal is part of a \$1 million election promise from the State Government, and is designed to inspire travellers to visit regional areas.

Last year Gwalia Historic Precinct was visited by the WA Museum during the development of this new tourism portal.

Three pieces were selected from Gwalia Museum's collection, which include the Sons of Gwalia seal, assay pots, and a 1910 Rifle Club medallion.

25 YEARS IN THE MAKING—THE OUTBACK WAY

In 1997 the Shire of Laverton President, Cr Patrick Hill, created the Outback Highway Development Council Inc (OHDC Inc), which comprised of an Alliance of Councils across Western Australia, Northern Territory and Queensland.

The purpose of this Alliance was to work together to seal the roads that cut across the middle of Australia from Laverton in WA to Winton in Queensland. These roads make up The Outback Way—Australia's Longest Shortcut.

This section of Outback highway covers 2700kms and the project is expected to be completed by 2027/28, with approximately half of the road now sealed. OHDC Inc have secured \$1.2 billion in funding from the Federal Government and the three State Governments. The new Labor Government has committed their ongoing support of the Outback Way, with funding announced in the March Budget.

The 25 year anniversary of the project was celebrated at the 2022 Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) Congress, with a presentation and cake cutting with ALGA President, Linda Scott. (Pictured)

Boulie Shire Mayor, Rick Britton said that “the sealing of this network will give the people living in isolated and remote Australia...through the heart of Australia new opportunities.”


Over 25 years, the OHDC Inc's Purpose and Values have enabled the collaboration to endure and progress throughout many Governmental changes, including 32 combined Federal, State and Territory Elections, and 43 Federal, State and Territory Transport/Infrastructure Ministers.

With project completion now only a few years away the OHDC Inc will begin the sustainable development plan for the corridor. The plan will include the communities' capacity and initiatives, and the Mining, Freight, Agriculture and Tourism industries needs will be taken into account. Local recycled content will be secured to complete the sealing.

The sealing of the highway will not only increase the safety and accessibility of the route but will increase connectivity between communities thanks to reduced travel times. The upgrades will also provide opportunities for a range of industries to operate along the corridor.

The Department of Infrastructure believes that investing in the Outback Way will provide social and economic benefits for surrounding communities. “By improving access to health and social services, these upgrades help...to increase standards of living and equity for Indigenous communities.”

Did You Know...?

ON THIS DAY...

July 1899

The Leonora Road Board proposed that a permanent hospital be purchased and set up near Leonora, which will do away with the present temporary structures, mainly reinforced tents, which are in use. The Gwalia folk are the main supporters of the new hospital; also the mine promised to donate a considerable sum.

July 1903

Now that the railway is through to Leonora, prices on all items, food and clothing, have been reduced, due to the railway rates being much less than the rates previously paid to the hauliers. One wonders what the fate will be of the hardworking little donkeys and camels that have done such a mighty service over the past few years.



A large Government dam is being excavated at the Malcolm Soak, near Mick O'Donohue's Malcolm Soak Hotel. The excavation is to enlarge the existing small dam as bigger supplies of water will be required by more locomotives using the new line.

July 1920

A meeting was held in Leonora in an endeavour to form a scout troop. About 15 boys handed in their names, and it appears that a troop will be able to be established in Leonora.

Wiluna Vocational Training Commences with Solid Engagement


Nationally recognised Vocational Training has commenced within the Wiluna Community, with Carey Training delivering a Certificate II in Civil Construction this month for an 8-week duration.

The first week welcomed up to 20 students taking part in training modules – all assisting each other to navigate the theoretical component of training. From Week 5 students will take part in a broader Wiluna Community Place Project using skid steer machinery, covering hands-on approaches to plant operations fundamentals.

This Project will be in partnership with the Shire of Wiluna and form part of a capacity building project that will provide a cultural element to the entrance of Wiluna.

Local employer visits have been welcomed, presenting motivational employment led discussions with students as they prepare for next steps in their career pathways.



Dear Homeowner/occupier

Important safety message from the electrical safety regulator

Switch off the power before entering the roof space

There are serious electrical hazards in roof spaces and the potential for electric shocks is high. Hazards can include deteriorated electrical cables or joints.

For your safety and the safety of your family, please follow these steps, before entering the roof space:

- **Switch off the power at the main switchboard/meter box by turning the main switch to the 'OFF' position.**
- Tape the switch and/or label it so someone else does not turn it back on while you are working up there.
- Let someone know where you are.
- Use a torch and cordless power tools.
- Do not disturb or alter any electrical wiring or junction boxes.
- Keep thermal insulation away from light fittings.
- If you see any damaged or bare wires, call a licensed Electrical Contractor immediately. Do not DIY electrical work.

By law, all tradespersons who need to enter the roof space at your property, must turn off the power at the main switchboard/meter box prior to doing so. Check with them to make sure they have done this before allowing them into your roof space.

Note: This applies to most work (not just electrical work) carried out within the roof space of residential and commercial premises. This may include air-conditioning installers, gas fitters, plumbers, insulators, solar installers, roof carpenters, and pest controllers. There are limited occasions where a tradesperson can work in the roof space with the power on.

Building and Energy has developed stickers to be affixed to the roof space manhole and at the main switchboard/meter box respectively. They should serve as a reminder to turn off the power before anyone enters the roof space.
