Our catering team will prepare a menu to your requirements; we can do everything for you! Organise some fun bowl activities for your group.



We believe in the importance of family, community and empowering our children with knowledge and understanding to take care of the land we live on. What Can I Compost?

So you're sold and you want to start composting, but what goes into the bin?
Compost is broken into two general categories: greens and browns.

Greens

Quick to rot and they provide important nitrogen and moisture.

- Vegetable scraps
- Fruit scraps
- Tea bags
- Coffee grounds and filter paper
- Seaweed
- Used hops
- Old flowers and nettles
- Grass cuttings
- Bedding plants
- Weeds - avoid weeds that have gone to seed, as seeds will survive all that the composting process kills

Browns

Typically slower to rot but provide fibre and carbon and also allow important air pockets to form in the mixture.

- Egg shells
- Peanut shells
- Corn cobs and stalks
- Egg and cereal boxes
- Corrugated cardboard
- Garden prunings
- Twigs and hedge clippings
- Straw and hay
- Ashes from wood and paper
- Unprocessed wood chippings
- Wood
- Cotton threads and string
- Feathers
- Vacuum bag contents
- Old natural fibre clothes
- Toilet and kitchen roll tubes
- Tissues, paper towels and nappies
- Shredded paper

Do Not Include

Putting these in your bin can encourage unwanted pests and can also create odor.

- Meat and dairy products
- Cooking oil
- Rice
- Bread products
- Walnuts
- Discarded plants
- Sawdust
- Heavily coated or printed paper
- Dog poo or cat litter, or soiled diapers
- Used personal product soiled with human blood or fluid

Support Hub Update

The Cashless Debit Card Support Hub team and the Department of Justice had an amazing turn out during the “One-Stop-Shop” Open Days in Leonora. Community members were helped with identification, fines and driver’s license business, housing enquiries and more.

A lot of our members within community were able to access the following services such as The Department of Transport, Sheriff/CDO, Service Australia, Registry of Birth, Deaths, and Marriages, Waalitj Foundation and Housing Department.



Department of Transport had a very busy 2 days on our Open Day with appointments from 9am right through to 4pm. Most participants went home with Learners Permits after passing their theory test and some passed their driving test and are now on their P Plates!

During the 2-day event we the CDC Support Hub team were able to financially assist just under 60 odd customers who benefited from the services offered.

Being able to help someone gain their Birth Certificate, Proof of Identification or a Drivers ID brings them one step closer to being employed.

With a queue of customers lining up and several people who were already currently being assisted by one of the services agents, members of the community were asked to have a seat in the waiting area and were provided with a hot cup of tea or coffee followed by a hot dog.

A Federal Grant through Department of Social Services funds all CDC Support Hub services.

Construction has Begun on Aging in Place Units!

We are excited to announce that construction has started on the Ageing in Place units on Stuart Street!

In August 2020 The State Government announced \$3.5 million of funding towards the construction of an independent living village in Leonora Shire. This funding is part of the WA Government's Regional Aged Accommodation Program and the The Shire of Leonora is contributing \$1 million to the \$4.5 million project.

The Leonora Ageing in Place project is being built adjacent to the main street and comprise eight modern units with individual private courtyards. The facility will also include a community hall, communal gardens and barbecue facilities.


The units will incorporate best practice ageing in place principles, enabling residents to live independently in the community while accessing local and visiting support services as they are required. The Leonora Ageing in Place project will help the community retain residents who may otherwise be forced to move away due to a lack of appropriate accommodation.

Comments attributed to Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan:

"The delivery of independent living accommodation in Leonora is important for the Northern Goldfields as it will provide modern and secure accommodation, helping older residents to remain in their community where they are familiar and comfortable."



"This project is a good example of local government working together with the Goldfields-Esperance Development Commission and the WA Government to deliver a positive outcome for the region."

#SaferLeonora Plan Officially Launched

A Safer Leonora Committee Meeting was held on Tuesday 9th of August in which the #saferleonora plan was officially launched. With the official adoption of the #SaferLeonora Committee on 26 April 2022, the Shire of Leonora is leading the way for the Goldfields-Esperance region with the Committee being the only one of its kind in the whole region.

Leonora Police Station Officer in Charge Sergeant Jamie Cresswell said "We facilitated extensive community consultation sessions in Leonora, in partnership with the Shire of Leonora and it was highlighted that the community had a strong desire to come together in a structured way to be part of the solution and make their community safer for everyone".

"Development of the #SaferLeonora Committee will enhance community safety and contribute towards reducing crime in Leonora through collaboration and coordination of key stakeholders and community members" Sergeant Cresswell said. "By engaging the community and stakeholders, and supporting them to work together, effectively communicate with each other and pool their resources, the outcomes for the community in dealing with identified issues will be far greater."

The Shire of Leonora is a key driver of the #SaferLeonora Committee, reaffirming their commitment to addressing issues associated with community safety. Shire of Leonora President Peter Craig said "While the police have a significant role in ensuring community safety, we realise the benefit of supporting and encouraging our community to be part of the solution."

The Committee is responsible for overseeing the implementation of the Shire of Leonora #SaferLeonora Plan 2022-2027 through effective partnerships to support the coordination and integration of community safety and crime prevention activities within the Shire of Leonora.

The development of a community safety committee is a proven collective impact model to successfully influence crime prevention at the local level. For more information about the #SaferLeonora Committee contact the Shire of Leonora on (08) 9037 6044.

The #SaferLeonora Plan 2022-2027 is a five year strategic outlook for Leonora Police and the Shire of Leonora that aims to map the issues of primary concern to the community and key stakeholders, and document strategies and partnerships to alleviate these issues.

The Plan considers the perception of crime as well as the actual crime. A safe community is one where community members are able to pursue the fullest life possible without fear or hinderance of crime, making their feelings of safety as important as their actual level of safety.

Did you know...?

Mr Ernest Henry Bird

Fancy a casual stroll from Southern Cross to Menzies?

Ernest Henry Bird arrived in Western Australia from Adelaide. He walked from Southern Cross to Menzies in 1895 and established a drapery business in Menzies with his brothers.

They extended this business to Leonora in 1897 and, in 1902, Ernest Bird dissolved his partnership with his brothers and ceased his interest in the Menzies business to take on sole proprietorship of the Leonora drapery store.

This shop catered for the ladies of Leonora, selling drapery, boots, children's clothing, millinery, patterns and dress materials. A dressmaker was also employed for special orders of clothing.

In 1899, Ernest Bird employed as manager Charles Bevan who was involved in many sporting activities in Leonora including the Rifle and Racing clubs. In 1901 he was elected to the first Municipal Council.

Mr Bird sold his interest in the business in June 1907 to the firm of Birchley & Coates, which traded until 1909. Ernest Bird returned to Adelaide where he died in 1944.

September is Prostate

Awareness Month

Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Western Australian men, so Cancer Council WA is using Prostate Cancer Awareness month this September to issue a timely reminder to men in the Goldfields to know the common symptoms of the disease.

It's vital Goldfields men visit their local doctor, Aboriginal health worker or clinic nurse if they experience unusual symptoms as currently there is not a suitable test that can be used to screen for prostate cancer.

Common symptoms of prostate cancer include, waking a lot at night to pee, a sudden or urgent need to pee, problems starting or stopping peeing, needing to pee more often, a slow or weak flow when peeing, or dribbling at the end of peeing.

These symptoms can be found in other conditions but if you have had any of these for more than four weeks, or you've noticed blood in your pee or semen even just once, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible. It doesn't mean you've got prostate cancer – often it turns out to be something far less serious and your doctor may be able to help reduce the annoying symptoms.

In Western Australia in 2019, the risk of being diagnosed with prostate cancer by age 75 years was 1 in 8 for men. In 2019, there were 2,299 new cases of prostate cancer recorded and 248 deaths.

In the Goldfields region, 46 men were diagnosed with prostate cancer, compared to 4 deaths.

When cancer is found at an earlier stage, there is a better chance of successful treatment, so finding cancer early can make a real difference. For more information about prostate cancer symptoms, visit www.findcancerearly.com.au or call Cancer Council's information and support line on 13 11 20.

The prostate is a small gland of the male reproductive system. In many men, it gets larger with age.

What is a PSA test?

The Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) test is a simple blood test that helps identify concerns with the prostate. Monitoring PSA levels in the blood helps to detect prostate cancer early, so we can beat it.

Do you need a PSA test?



Do you have a family history of prostate cancer?

NO. Talk to your doctor about PSA testing starting at age 50. If you develop symptoms, talk to your doctor the same day.



YES. Talk to your doctor about PSA testing starting at age 40. If you develop symptoms, talk to your doctor the same day.



Do you know the symptoms?

Prostate cancer often has no symptoms at its earliest stages. As it grows, symptoms could include difficulty or pain when urinating or ejaculating, pain in the hips, thighs, or lower back, and blood in your urine or semen. If you experience any of these symptoms, see your doctor.

Prostate Cancer Fighting Chicken Sausage and Kale Pizza



Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 3 chicken or turkey sausages, casings removed
- 1 tablespoon panko or cornmeal
- Whole wheat pizza dough, or refrigerated or frozen pizza crust (see Chef Tips)
- ½ cup tomato sauce (see Chef Tips)
- ¾ cup mozzarella cheese, grated
- ¾ cup packed kale leaves, washed, patted dry, and torn into pieces
- ½ cup cherry or grape tomatoes, halved
- Salt and pepper to taste

Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 500 degrees. Put 2 baking trays into the oven, or pizza stone if you have one.
2. In a sauté pan, heat olive oil. Once it's hot, cook the sausages until cooked through and starting to brown. Pour onto a plate lined with a paper towel.
3. Split the dough into 4 equal balls if making personal pizzas. Sprinkle panko or cornmeal onto a large sheet of parchment paper. Roll out the dough onto the parchment paper; press out dough into a 12x8-inch rectangle or to fit your pizza stone. Split into two balls if necessary.
4. Spread the Quick Tomato Sauce evenly onto the dough and sprinkle with cheese. Top with kale, sausage, and grape tomatoes, cut sides up. Sprinkle with a little salt and pepper.
5. Using the parchment paper, slip the pizza onto the heated baking trays or pizza stone. Bake in the oven on the lowest rack for 10-15 minutes, or until the crust is golden and the cheese is bubbling.
6. Using the parchment paper, slip the pizza onto a cutting board and cut into slices. Drizzle with olive oil if desired. Serve with a simple green salad.

Celebrating CDP remote based participants Gaining Skills and Qualifications

The Waalitj Foundation recently celebrated 14 Community Development Program (CDP) participants and 3 staff members from Laverton, Mount Margaret, and Leonora Communities (Yaaliku Region WA) through a Certificate Ceremony held at the Laverton Training Centre (An initiative of Australian Potash). WA Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan presented all students with Certificates on the day, acknowledging the training provided solid career pathways.

Nationally Accredited Vocational Training units in Senior First Aid, Basic Machinery and Ranger Training delivered by Central Regional TAFE formed part of a Certificate II in Rural Operations, tailored to align with genuine on-country Northern Goldfields employment opportunities. This targeted approach allows locally accessible training with flexibility for students along with a culturally supportive learning environment.

Coordinated efforts commenced earlier this year (March 2022) as a broader partnership between the Waalitj Foundation CDP Program Manager Bianca Corciulo, Mac Jensen (Laverton Training Centre Manager) and Sarah Sullivan (Australian Potash) working closely with lead Activity Supervisors Garry Adams and Chris Hedlam.

"Through consistent dedication in engaging with students and their families, both Chris and Garry as lead Activity Supervisors have been able to retain 100% of attendance. Their work as leaders and mentors to students across local communities is commendable on every level!" Bianca Corciulo, Waalitj Foundation.

From March this year, a number of Waalitj students have secured employment as a direct result of training, whilst other local businesses employing Waalitj participants are looking to increase capacity of their current employees.

Further planning and consultation continue into 2023 across the Region with additional partnerships formed supporting pre-employability including support securing identification and driver training programs delivered through a partnership with the Department of Justice and Department of Transport and local Shire Councils. Aboriginal Open Days have been well attended by staff and local participants. In-house support across Waalitj offices Regionally will also support regularity of these services with a person-centred approach.
