## MAN WITH A PRAM EVENT



Up to one in 10 men experience postnatal anxiety and depression. Unfortunately, there aren't enough tools available to help identify symptoms in men. Because of this there isn't enough support available for new fathers and this can have

ongoing consequences, not only for the father but for the children and the family unit as a whole.

Dad's Group is an organisation that is working to create a support network of fathers around the country to help combat the challenges that come with fatherhood. To do this they raise funds through Man With A Pram, a nation-wide event that is held on Father's Day every year. The events are organised and hosted by groups or individuals with the aim of connecting isolated fathers and celebrating fatherhood.

This year's focus was on men's perinatal mental health and funds raised from all events goes to perinatal health programs and research for fathers. The events bring fathers and families together to combat isolation and bring the community together.

Leonora's Man With A Pram event was held on Saturday, 4th September. It began with the Walk of Doom from Hoover House and ended at the town oval for an action packed afternoon. There was something for the whole family-not just dads-with bouncy castles, fairy floss, ice cream, and food vans. Unfortunately,

dunk-a-dad was cancelled due to the cool weather but there was still plenty for the dads to do—including being covered in coloured chalk during the walk, two-up in the evening, and the obstacle course.

The Ultimate Dad Challenge obstacle course involved racing other dads to complete tasks such as climbing Mount Wash-more to find the missing sock, a barefoot Lego walk, finding the correct socket to fix a flat tyre, and carrying all the groceries in one trip. The race ended with a wooden stick horse ride across the finish line. Local clubs were also represented with obstacles from Leonora Extended Shooting Club, Leonora Bowls Club, Leonora Golf Club and Leonora Racing Club.

Prizes were awarded for challenge winners, as well as for a number of other categories. Thank you to MLG who donated \$500 worth of Freerange Supplies gift vouchers for prize winners.



Please be advised that the Goldfields Nullarbor Rangelands Biosecurity Association will shortly be undertaking its September Spring 2021 Wild Dog Control – (1080 ground baiting), in the Northern Goldfields, Goldfields and Nullarbor Regions.

**The baiting is undertaken to reduce the impact of wild dogs on livestock on pastoral leases.**

Please note the following:

- It is planned that 1080 baits will be laid in the period between Friday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2021. **These baits will remain active for a longer period. Please remain aware.**
- The baits will be the dried meat form, which contain 1080 Sodium fluoroacetate, which is a naturally occurring toxin found in some Western Australian flora species. As such, most native fauna species have evolved tolerance to it. **DOMESTIC DOGS AND CATS have ZERO TOLERANCE**
- Whilst these baits are laid in areas with appropriate exclusion zones/buffers (e.g. no baits within 500m of townsite boundaries or residential dwellings, or within 250m of public roads and tracks), and target specifically, wild dogs and feral cats, they may pose a risk to domestic dogs and cats, if these animals are taken into the baited areas.
- **Accordingly, please warn all visitors who may bring domestic animals into the area and post signage as attached to this email, and this letter in a prominent place for the general public to observe.**

## MUSEUM TOURISM PORTAL VISITS GWALIA



Gwalia Historic Precinct was recently visited by the WA Museum as part of the development of a new “tourism portal” designed to attract visitors to regional areas. The portal is part of the WA Regional Collections Project for Collections WA. The Collections WA platform was launched in June last year by the Minister for Culture and the Arts, as part of a \$1 million election promise from the State Government to promote regional museums and collections.

Culture and the Arts Minister David Templeman states “the potential this platform has to share our stories, increase local, national and international audiences, and drive tourism to the regions is immense.”

The Golden Outback region was the fourth region to be visited by WA Museum for this project, having previously captured collections from the South West, Coral Coast and the North West. There were over 50 organisations visited in a three week period, including Aboriginal language centres, Aboriginal cultural facilities, historic buildings, art galleries, museums, and private collections, among others.

WA Museum’s Roz Lipscombe was accompanied by photographer Bo Wong and curator and writer Tui Raven for the Golden Outback section of the project. Gwalia Museum houses many interesting and unique items, many with fascinating back stories, and so, it was difficult to select which items should be included in the portal. With the assistance of the team three items were selected that would stand out on the website, and the photos and accompanying story would intrigue people enough that they will want to visit our area.

The pieces selected include a Sons of Gwalia seal, assay pots and the 1910 Rifle Club Medallion found by Mr Ric Van Rhoda at the base of Mt Leonora in 2019. The tourism portal is still in development but the photos have been made available to us to share.

# Did You Know...?

## MEDAL PRESENTED FOR SAVING A LIFE



Mr Alfred Phillip Reynolds

In May 1951, the Royal Humane Society held a Jubilee Ball at Leonora. Presentations were made by Mr W. Marshall, MLA, who was touring his electorate.

A silver medal was presented to Alfred Phillip Reynolds for the rescue of his workmate from death or serious injury for the following deed.

On the 25th May, 1949 at about 7.45pm, William Edgar Read, a miner at the Sons of Gwalia Gold Mine, had just lit two charges of gelignite in the leading stope, on number 31 level about 1524m from the surface.

Alfred Phillip Reynolds was working with Read and saw him light the fuses and walk away with another miner, Giacomo Mascherpa. Reynolds then walked about 6m away when he heard an explosion on the level above followed by a cracking sound, looking around he saw a large stone loosened by the explosion fall, where it then struck Read.

The stone was about 4m by 1m by .6m and would have weighed approximately 1.8 tonnes. It knocked Read over and came to rest on his left foot, trapping him about 3m from the burning fuses he had just lit. The usual length of a fuse is 2.4m but in this case the length was shortened to approximately 1m to prevent some of the fumes. Reynolds heard Read call out and running back to Read, he tried to lift the stone but it was too heavy. Reynolds then ran to the burning fuses, pulled them from the holes and removed the plugs of gelignite which he threw behind some stones around the corner, where they exploded harmlessly a few moments later.

Reynolds along with Mascherpa and another miner, Recaldini, got a steel drill and levered the stone from Read's foot, he was then placed on a trolley that was taken to the surface. Read was taken to hospital where it was found that he had a broken bone in his foot and a bruised back.

Thanks to the bravery of Reynolds, Read avoided becoming a statistic that day. Since the birth of the mine in 1896 there have been 83 recorded deaths of miners, and countless serious injuries.

Both men went on to live relatively long lives.

William Read died in 1963 at the age of 61.

Alfred Reynolds had married Edna Hayward in 1936, they had 6 children and he died in 1997 in Kalgoorlie at the age of 83.

Today, the Gwalia mine is the deepest trucking mine in the world, currently extending more than 1600m below the surface with a plan to reach 2300m by 2031. It takes the truck drivers about two hours to make their way to the surface with a load.

## MENTAL HEALTH WEEK



Mental Health Week is held every year around Australia, with each state and territory adopting its own theme. This year Mental Health Week in Western Australia will run from Saturday October 9th to Saturday October 16th.

Hope Community Services has released an information sheet that contains information on how alcohol affects mental health and solutions to help reduce alcohol intake. The information from this can found below.

### Alcohol and Mental Health



Alcohol consumption can play a role in the development and progression of mental health conditions.

Alcohol is a depressant—it slows down the central nervous system, including the brain. When alcohol affects the brain, it can negatively impact how we behave, think, and feel.

Research indicates people choose to drink alcohol to help cope with stress, anxiety, and depression. Although it does provide short-term relief, alcohol consumption can increase the likelihood of dependence, meaning we need more alcohol to cope with overwhelming experiences and/or everyday stresses.

Instead of alcohol to cope with stress, anxiety and depression, and poor sleep, here are some suggestions to try:

- Avoid screens 30 minutes before bed.
- Write your feelings in a safe place, such as a journal.
- Talk to a trusted person about how you are feeling.
- Keep active, even if it's a walk up and down your street.
- Have something healthy to eat.
- Ask for help.
- Allow more rest and relaxation time.

## BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and a great time to be breast aware and learn about the common symptoms of breast cancer. Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in women. It can occur at any age, but the risk is greater if you are over the age of 50.



Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side.
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast.
- Change in the look of your breast, like: your skin looks like the skin of an orange, your skin is wrinkling in small folds, redness or rash.
- Changes to the nipple, like it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy, or has a sore that won't heal.
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it's only on one side.
- An area of the breast that feels different to the rest.

Get to know your breasts and what's normal for you, and if you notice any unusual changes tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker.

If you have had any of these symptoms it doesn't mean you've got breast cancer—often they turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get them checked.



If it is breast cancer, the earlier it's found, the greater the chance of successful treatment.




Alan's passion was evident as he shared his love for community with his beautiful wife Sandra.

Our inaugural 'CDP TEAM CONFERENCE' has commenced in Perth this week, with all Regional staff in attendance.




