BACKGROUND

Lots 50, 51 and 52 Otterburn Street, Leonora were offered for sale by Public Auction on the 21st August, 2002. Lots 51 and 52 were both sold on that day.

In anticipation of additional industrial land being sought in the near future, and to save lengthy delays at that time, Council resolved at its meeting on the 19th November, 2002 that Lot 50 Otterburn Street, Leonora be offered for sale at any time in accordance with Section 3.58(3) of the Local Government Act 1995 should any person express an interest in purchasing the land.

John Henry and Bernice Ann RICH did on the 29th October, 2004 make an offer of \$20,000.00 (excluding GST) for Lot 50 Otterburn Street, Leonora. This offer reflects the current market value of the property as provided by the Valuer General's Office.

The Shire of Leonora did provide public notice of their intention to dispose of the property. The public notice appeared in the Kalgoorlie Miner on the 1^{st} November, 2004. Submissions in regards this disposition have been invited however the 14 day statutory period in which submissions can be accepted does not expire until the close of business on Monday 15^{th} November, 2004.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Section 3.58 (2) of the Local Government Act states that a local government can only dispose of property to -

- a) the highest bidder at public auction; or
- b) the person who at public tender called by the Local Government makes what is, in the opinion of the Local Government, the most acceptable tender, whether or not it is the highest tender.

Section 3.58(3) of the Local Government Act states that a local government can dispose of property other than mentioned above if, before agreeing to dispose of the property –

- a) It gives State-wide public notice of the proposed disposition -
 - (i) Describing the property concerned.
 - (ii) Giving details of the proposed disposition; and
 - (iii) Inviting submissions to be made to the local government before a date to be specified in the notice, being a date not less than 2 weeks after the notice is first given.

b) It considers any submissions made to it before the date specified in the notice and, if its decision is made by the council, the decision and the reason for it are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was made.

Section 3.58(4) of the Local Government Act 1995 states the details of a proposed disposition that are required –

- a) The names of all other parties concerned
- b) The consideration to be received by the Local Government for the disposition; and
- c) The market value of the disposition as ascertained by a valuation carried out not more than 6 months before the proposed disposition.

BACKGROUND

The Mt Weld Rare Earths project was formally assessed as a Public Environmental Review in 1992 and environmental approval was granted by the Minister for the Environment and Heritage in November 1992.

The Shire of Leonora at its meeting of Council on the 20th May, 2003 resolved that as the proposed changes at that time from the previously Approved Project did not impact negatively on the Leonora environment, that no objection be raised to the proposal submitted by Lynas Corporation Ltd.

Subsequent to that date, approval has been renewed on several occasions and non-substantial changes to the original plan approved. Lynas now wishes to make final modifications and simplification to the currently approved plan and requests a letter from the Shire of Leonora to the Department of Environment giving approval to the changes described below.

Feasibility studies over the past twelve months have shown that economic viability of the Mt Weld Rare Earth Project can be considerably enhanced by adoption of a plan for an integrated flotation concentrator and rare earths cracking plant in Shandong Province, China. Essentially, the lower costs at the Shandong site for process reagents, power, infrastructure and labour, roughly compensate for the higher costs of directly exporting the ore, consisting mainly of iron oxide and rare earth phosphates, to China.

A major additional advantage of the Shandong site, arising from proximity of extensive industrial infrastructure, is the ability to obtain value for all components of the ore including iron oxide and phosphate by-products that would otherwise be voided to tailings at Mt Weld.

All aspects of the mining plan remain unchanged; access route, contract mining regime, rate of mining, pit dimensions, life of project etc. The major changes to be made to the post-mining phase of the project are;

- Installation of a road train weigh station at Mt Weld to ensure road load limits are not exceeded.
- Increase in road train haulage from Mt Weld to Leonora via Laverton from 31,000 tonnes per year (rare earth concentrate) to 110,000 tonnes per year (iron oxide and rare earths phosphate ore.)

- Removal of the 110,000 tonne per annum flotation beneficiation plant and associated infrastructure; power plant, communications tower, concentrate storage etc.
- Reduction in radioactivity of transported material by approximately 50% to negligible public exposure levels.
- Elimination of the need for a process tailings dam at Mt Weld.
- Reduction in area to be cleared (no plant site, tailings dam etc)
- Elimination of road transport of process chemicals from Kwinana to Mt Weld.
- Reduction in fuel transport to site (no process plant power required, mobile campaign mining fleet and crusher only)

The iron oxide and rare earths ore will be road transported by quad road trains with 14 x 8 tonne covered kibbles aggregating 112 tonnes of ore. The kibbles will be the same as those currently used for transport of nickel concentrates to the Leonora rail siding. Approximately 20 loaded road trains per week will travel to Leonora siding and the same number return empty to Mt Weld. This compares with previous road train cycles of concentrate, flotation reagents and fuel of 8 - 9 movements per week.

The Mt Weld mine is scheduled for commencement of mining in the second quarter of 2005 with a major pre-strip operation. Ore mining, crushing and stockpiling will be underway in the third quarter and first trucking and shipment of ore commences in the fourth quarter. The first road train movements around Leonora are planned for October, 2005.
